The first and original creators of the Roman games were the Etruscans of Northern Italy. They held public games like Gladiator battles, Roman boxing, Hoop rolling, Roman ball game, indoor Roman activities and chariot races. These were held as a sacrifice to the gods. The Romans would hold the games roughly 10 – 12 times per year. The games were paid by the emperor because he wanted the poor to stay unemployed, and not rebel or hassle the upper class about not being occupied. The emperor would do this to distract the poor and make them forget about their harsh living conditions.

The emperors wanted to make the gladiator games famous and founded special schools for that. In the first century BCE, schools were made to help train people become gladiators. These gladiators had the ability to survive and even thrive off the game. Some of them didn't even live long enough to fight two or three battles, but the best would become popular heroes, win a lot of money and sponsors and even appear on graffiti on the walls of the Roman empire.
